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# Why Soft Skills Are Difficult to Scale

Empathy and communication are widely recognized as critical capabilities in modern organizations. In healthcare, they influence trust, experience, and adherence to treatment. In enterprise environments, they are closely associated with engagement, collaboration, and leadership effectiveness. Their importance is well understood. Their development at scale is not.

Most organizations continue to rely on workshops, coaching, and facilitated roleplay to address soft skills. While these methods have value, they are inherently limited. They are difficult to standardize, costly to sustain, and inconsistent in how feedback is delivered. As programs expand, leaders often lack clear insight into which skills are improving, where gaps persist, and whether training is translating into day-to-day behavior.
